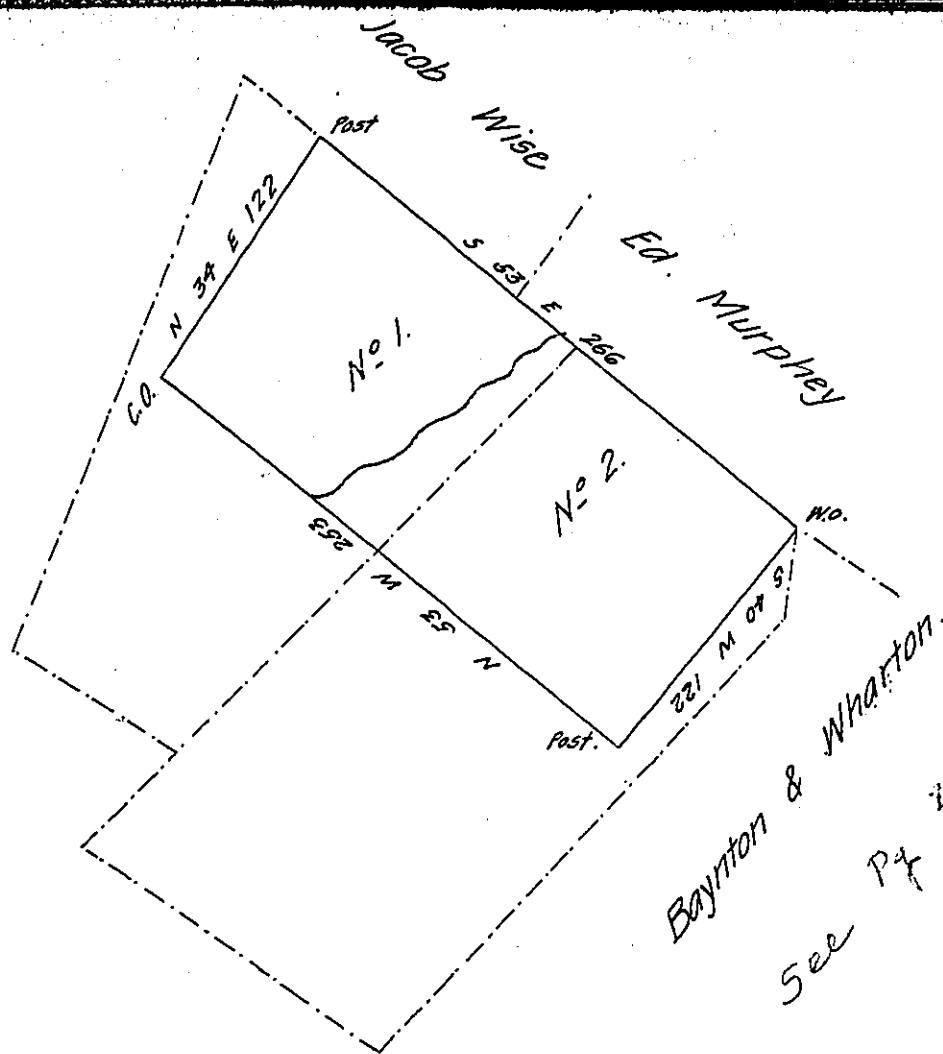

Thomas Coleman not returned James Farrel - not found

No 1 represents part of a Survey made for Thomas Coleman on Warrant dated the 2<sup>nd</sup> day of March 1787. This Survey interferes ninety three acres and one hundred and seven perches with the Charles Jolly Survey - Thomas Coleman is the present owner.

No 2 represents part of a Survey made for James Farrel on Warrant dated the 15<sup>th</sup> day of November 1787. This Survey interferes ninety one acres and Eighty four perches with the Charles Jolly Survey - James Farrel conveyed to Edward Hodges who - George Fellers who devised the same to his heirs who conveyed to Daniel McCalla John Mc Cormack John Cough & Robert Hambleton the present Owners.

IN TESTIMONY that the above is a copy of the original remaining on file in the Department of Internal Affairs of Pennsylvania, made conformably to an Act of Assembly approved the 16th day of February, 1833, I have hereunto set my Hand and caused the Seal of said Department to be affixed at Harrisburg, this third day of September 1908
