



Situate on the south side of Buffalo Creek about one & a half miles from the mouth in Buffalo township township Union County Surveyed 22<sup>d</sup> day of May 1838 by virtue of an order Granted to Christopher Paris Dated the 3<sup>d</sup> day of April 1769 N<sup>o</sup> 2565 Containing three hundred & one acres & forty perches & the usual allowance & is represented by the Green lines.

Note: the same interferes & is included in two Surveys one in the name of Michl Green and is represented by the Black lines & the other in the name of Thomas Forster & is represented by the Blue lines. Forster Order is N<sup>o</sup> 675, Greens 1462 Both orders are dated 3<sup>d</sup> April 1769 & both Surveys made the 12<sup>th</sup> August, 1769, & is now owned by Jonas Kephart & James Strawbridge in right of the said Green & Forster.
