Side of the W. branch of said Creek, about 20 Miles from Fort Augusta & joining a tract taken up by Cornelius Cox & on the upper side of said Tract including a Spring & extending up said Creek about 300 rods thence back towards the S. Side of said Creek chiefly Walnut, ash, & Hickory on the bottom land, black oak & White oak on the upland including his settlement. David Duncan appears to include the ground above described on App^r Nº 72. dated 3^d April 1769. Situate in Washington Township Lycoming County. Sam^l Hepburn Esq^r the heirs of Comly own the above.
