Report.

The above described Tract is wholly included within the lines of a larger Tract of 210<sup>3/4</sup> Acres & allowance. Resurveyed 17<sup>th</sup> October 1771 on a Warrant to John Venable dated 10<sup>th</sup> June 1762. and held by James Riddle under said Title. Note. No evidence appears of Grimes' Order being ever executed on the Land.
