Surveyed for Thomas More on order No 1360 Dated the 26<sup>th</sup> day of September 1766.

The dotted lines represent part of a Survey made for Barnabas Barnes on Warrant dated the 4<sup>th</sup> February 1755. This Survey interferes Seventy two acres and one hundred and twenty two acres and allowance with the Thomas More tract—Barnabas Barnes conveyed to W<sup>m</sup> Smith who devised the same to Richard Smith from whom the same was sold by the Sheriff to John McCahan the present owner.
