The dotted lines represent part of a Survey made for George Green on Warrant dated the 26<sup>th</sup> day of February 1794. This Survey interferes Two Hundred and twenty one acres and allowance with the Abraham Vandegrift tract - George Green conveyed part of this tract to John Barr whose heirs now own the Land. one other part George Green conveyed to James & John Sample the present owners.
