



A Draft of a Tract of Land Situate on the East Branch of Will's Creek in Londonderry township Bedford County containing Three Hundred and one and one fourth Acres and allowance of Six per cent for Roads &c. Surveyed for John Fulton The 27th day of June 1767. On Order N° 637 dated the 1st day of August 1766.

N° 1. represented by dotted lines is a draft of a tract of Land Surveyed for Jacob Tarwater on Warrant dated the 19th day of January 1785 - this tract Interferes Sixty Acres and fifteen perches with the John Fulton Survey - Jacob Tarwater conveyed to Henry Lyberger whose Heirs now own the Land.

N° 2. represented by dotted lines is part of a draft of a tract of Land Surveyed for Ludwick Lyberger by Virtue of an Improvement commenced in the year 1788 - this tract interferes one Acre and Ninety Six perches with the John Fulton Survey - Ludwick Lyberger is the present owner.

N° 3. represented by dotted lines is a draft of a Tract of Land Surveyed for John Shaw on Warrant dated the 10th day of September 1762 - this tract interferes One Hundred and Seventy two Acres and one hundred and five perches with the John Fulton Survey - John Shaw conveyed to William Peters who conveyed to Henry Lyberger whose heirs now own the land
