



Situate in Point Township Northumberland County on the North Side of the East branch of Susquehanna—on a small stream of Water emptying into said River between the mouth of Fishing Creek & the fork. Surveyed on the 21<sup>st</sup> day of October 1835 by virtue of an Application dated the 3<sup>rd</sup> of Ap<sup>l</sup> 1769 N<sup>o</sup> 528 granted to William Blair. Containing two hundred and Sixty Acres & one quarter & the usual all<sup>s</sup> of Six Per Cent &c.

Note. The same tract of land was surveyed the day of—1769 for James Wilson in pursuance of his application dated the 5<sup>th</sup> day of September 1769 N<sup>o</sup> 3846 and is now owned and occupied by Dan<sup>l</sup> Robins in right of said James Wilson.
