


FORM NO. 1.



That part of the above diagram represented by the dotted line including the letters A. B. C. D. E. shows the Survey made to George Mc Connell on the 25 of January 1828. a return whereof is herewith enclosed. It will be seen by reference to the dates in the above diagram that the land has been previously Surveyed on Warrants issued by the Commonwealth at the times therein stated. The Survey now made for George Mc Connell is occupied by George Rapine who claims on the title of John Cox which tract I am informed is patented. The tract in the name of Henry Smith is occupied by the Widow Moorhead but not owned by her, owned I understand by a person by the name of Smith in Westmoreland County. The Survey of Mc Connell I have made upon the land called for by the Location as near as can be ascertained. It has been laid upon the first run below the crossing of the Kittanning path on ~~the~~ what I am informed was at an early day called the West Side of Black Lick Creek but which is more properly the North or Northwest side. There is no person claiming under this Location at present known to me.
