Note. The same being part of a tract of 62 9/2 Acres of land. Surveyed the 25th day of February 1769 for Captain John Brady being the Allotment which fell to him on the division of a tract of 8000^{as} Surveyed for the Officers of Colonel Turbut Francis's Corps in pursuance of an Order of Survey N^o 1. And now Owned & occupied by Abbot Green in right of the Said John Brady. To Jacob Spangler Esq^r.
