



Application 4272, 4th Aug: 1767, to James Young for 100^{ac.} joining the Maryland Line.

The above Tract is an Interference of 100 acres now held by James and Henry McDivitt in right of Will^m. Cochran to whom the same, as part of a larger Tract called Carrollsburg, was conveyed by Charles Carroll by Deed dated 6th May, 1757, Part A. by the running of the Penna. & Maryland line fell on the side of Pennsylvania, and is now situate in Liberty Town^{sh}.
