



In pursuance of the authority of the Board of Property and of the several acts of Assembly directing the recovery of the principal and interest due to the Commonwealth from persons holding lands by virtue of Locations or other office titles issued from or under the proprietary government I have this 16<sup>th</sup> day of January 1828 Surveyed the above described tract of land containing Two hundred and ninety four acres and one hundred and twelve perches and Allowance of Six pr Cent adjoining lands of Alexander Cornahan & W<sup>m</sup> Dublican Martha Irwin William Lee &c Situate below and adjoining Edward Fowler on both sides of the South Branch of Black Lick Creek in Wheatfield Township in the County of Indiana By virtue of a warrant granted to George Irwin on the 20<sup>th</sup> of October 1772.
