Report.
 The above tract is wholly covered by a survey of 308^a 101^{ps} made 1st May 1769. on an order to Thomas Barrett dated July 2^d 1767 No 4108 the dotted black lined figure represents the balance of survey on Barretts order. The red figure marked A of 34^a 55^{ps} & allowance is also included within the lines of a tract of 285^a held on warrant to Archibald Elliott dated 26 Feb^y 1787

An order of survey dated 9th January 1767 No 2319. granted James McConahie for 100 acres joining Francis Elliott in Fannet township was probably intended for the above land- The title to Barrett is that by which the land seems to be held; Note- No evidence of possession in Welmith or McConahie, or of any person claiming under either of them.
