



Land survey to Jas Sharp on Warrant ~~Sept~~ Oct 1765

Draught of a tract of land situate in Green township, ^{formerly Letterkenny township, Cumberland County now Letterkenny Franklin County} containing one hundred & five acres one hundred and fifty three perches & allowance of six per cent for roads &c. Located in pursuance of a contract with the Board of Property for carrying into effect the several Acts of Assembly relating to unpatented lands under proprietary rights &c. and by virtue of an order of survey to Hugh Ferguson for 100 A^s "joining his other land on the South Mountain in Letterkenny" bearing date 9th May 1768 No 4966.

Report.

The above described tract is wholly covered and forms a part of 302 1/4^a survey^s 15 April 1768 on an order to Hugh Ferguson for 200^a dated 24 Feb^y 1767 No 2873. & confirmed by patent to Hugh & Elizabeth Ferguson.

Note.

It is presumed that as the order of 24 Feb^y 1767 for 200 A^s did not properly cover all the land then survey^d that the additional order was intended to cover the balance as Hugh Ferguson still the owner of the land claims no other land on said order save the original survey above mentioned.
