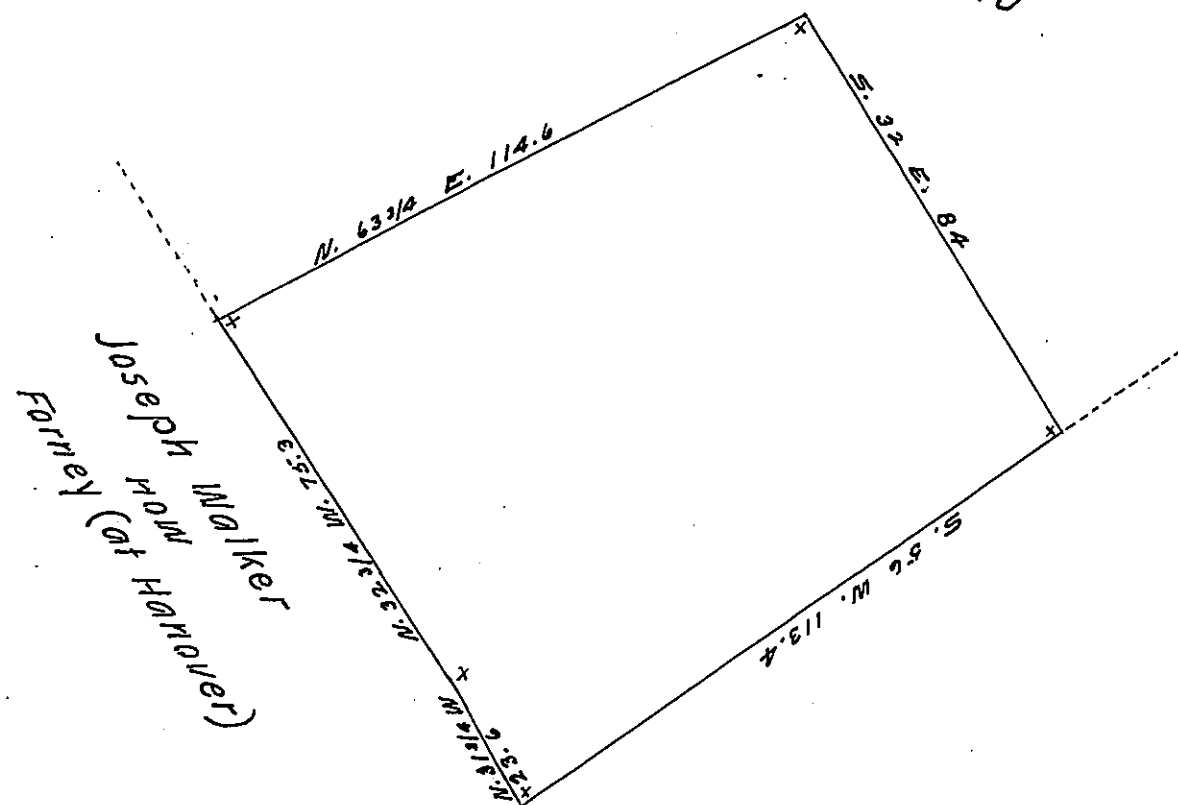


SAM<sup>l</sup> Neely

Application No 4766, 29<sup>th</sup> Feb<sup>y</sup> 1768, to Samuel Neely for 50 acres in Tyrone township.

The above tract is an interference of a tract of 61 acres & 21 p<sup>s</sup> and allow<sup>ee</sup> surveyed on warrant to Samuel Nilly dated March 1<sup>st</sup> 1744 for 100 a<sup>s</sup> being part of a larger tract, situate in Tyrone township Adams County, now owned by John Stewart and James L. Neely.
