


FORM No. 1.



Situate in Paradise township in the County of York, the whole tract containing 15.8<sup>acres</sup> 154 perches and the allowance &c was first surveyed (as will appear by a return herewith sent) in pursuance of an application entered by Michael Kraft for 175<sup>acres</sup> dated the 2<sup>d</sup> of March 1768 and No 4775. Part of the same within the red lines was afterwards surveyed in pursuance of Frederick Sheaffer's application for 50<sup>acres</sup> No 4752 dated the 12<sup>th</sup> day of February 1768, containing 59<sup>acres</sup> 62 perches &c - a return of which is also herewith sent, the same 59<sup>acres</sup> 62 perches was again surveyed and returned in pursuance of a warrant granted to Peter Dewald for 60<sup>acres</sup> dated — day of 18<sup>th</sup> March 1785 and patented on the last warrant, and that part within the yellow lines was again surveyed the 20<sup>th</sup> of March 1785 in pursuance of a warrant granted to Andrew Trimmer for 100<sup>acres</sup> dated the 4<sup>th</sup> of March 1785 containing 99<sup>acres</sup> 92 perches &c and patented to Henry Rentzel the 27<sup>th</sup> May 1812 this part is owned and occupied by Ezekiel Williams & Henry Christ and that within red lines owned and occupied by Andrew Trimmer.

Reported &c per contract the 10<sup>th</sup> of September 1828.
