



IN PURSUANCE OF AN ACT OF THE GENERAL ASSEMBLY OF THE STATE
OF PENNSYLVANIA, PASSED THE 24th DAY OF FEBRUARY, 1786, ENTITLED,
"AN ACT FOR DIRECTING THE MODE OF DISTRIBUTING THE DONATION

AC. NO 1898, SITUATE IN DISTRICT NO 2, ON THE WEST SIDE OF
THE ALLEGHENY RIVER, IN THE COUNTY OF WESTMORELAND.
