



IN PURSUANCE OF AN ACT OF THE GENERAL ASSEMBLY OF THE STATE OF PENNSYLVANIA, PASSED THE 24<sup>th</sup> DAY OF FEBRUARY, 1785, ENTITLED, "AN ACT FOR DIRECTING THE MANNER OF DISTRIBUTING THE DONATION LANDS," PROMISED THE TRAVELERS BY THIS COMMONWEALTH; AND BY ORDER OF THE SURVEYOR GENERAL, WITH THE APPROBATION OF THE HONORABLE THE EXECUTIVE COUNCIL, I HAVE SURVEYED, ON THE 21<sup>st</sup> DAY OF JUNE, 1786, THE ABOVE DESCRIBED TRACT OF TWO HUNDRED ACRES OF LAND, AND ALLOWANCE FOR ROADS, &c. NO 1896, SITUATE IN DISTRICT NO 2, ON THE WEST SIDE OF THE ALLEGHENY RIVER, IN THE COUNTY OF WESTMORELAND.
