


FORM NO 1.



Draught of a tract of land situate in Hamilton township in the county of Franklin, containing in all sixty four acres thirty two perches and allowance of six per cent for roads &c. Resurveyed 11<sup>th</sup> September 1829. In pursuance of a contract with the Board of Property for carrying into effect the several Acts of Assembly relating to unpatented lands under proprietary rights &c. and by virtue of a warrant dated

14 February 1775 granted to Thomas Shirly, for 60 acres "joining James Patterson, on the north" beginning at a w.o. corner tree on Dixon's branch of Back creek in Hamilton township.

Report. The above tract is found to interfere with a larger tract of 181<sup>st</sup> survey 21 June 1765 on warrant to David Brigham, dated 3<sup>rd</sup> June 1762 excepting only the small triangle marked A containing 86 perches which does not interfere with any office right. Note, the above tract was first surveyed 15 Feb<sup>y</sup> 1776 on Shirley's warrant
