Report. The above tract is covered by the following office rights to wit:
The part marked A is separated from B by dotted line containing 148⁹/113 P.
It was surveyed 1st May 1792 on warrant to Stephen Caldwell, dated 10th
Feb 1792 which is presumed to include the ancient seat of Jas. Caldwell
as marked on the draft. The part marked B surveyed for Stephen
Caldwell, the same time on warrant to Robert Caldwell, dated 22nd Feb
1787 as per official surveys in office.

The dotted figures without the above survey recognized as the land
of widow Caldwell, in 1754 by an adjoining survey. The figure C surveyed
on warrant to Robt. Caldwell, dated 1st September 1787. The figure D.
surveyed on warrant to John Caldwell, dated 24th Feb 1786. The figure
E. surveyed on warrant to Nicholas Eshway, dated 14 Augt 1794 who then
owned the land now returned. Owned & occupied by Jacob Martin &
David Siegher, under the above title to Stephen & Robert Caldwell.
