



Draught of a tract of land situate part in Guilford and part in Green (formerly Letterkenny) townships Franklin County, containing in all one hundred eighty four acres eighteen perches and allowance of six per cent for roads &c. Located in pursuance of a contract with the Board of property for ascertaining surveying and returning unpatented lands under proprietary rights &c. And by virtue of a warrant dated the 20th May 1766. Granted to Thomas Burney, for 200 acres "on Gonococheague creek joining James Elliott, James Henderson, Richard Venable, and his other land partly in Guilford and partly in Letterkenny townships. Ascertained on the premises — day of April 1830

Report. The above tract is covered by the following office rights to wit; The part of the tract marked A separated from B by dotted lines & containing 156.9, 100.2 & al is wholly the same as a tract surveyed 15 March 1811 on warrant to James Elliott, dated 30th October 1765 and held under said title Pat. That part marked B is included within the lines of a larger tract of 246 1/4 acres surveyed 28 April 1766 on warrant to Robert Eury, dated 24 May 1753 and held under said title. The dotted figure G represents the balance of survey on Eury's warrant. Pat. Owners Christian Peter & Samuel Lehman, and occupiers.
