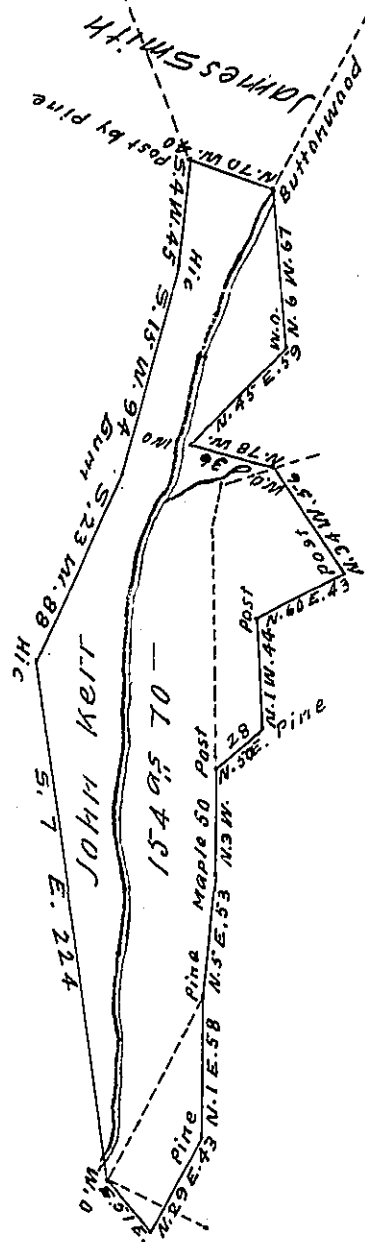


Barrens

N.B. The dotted and two black lines are part of a draft of a tract of land surveyed for Henry Sipe on warrant dated the 26<sup>th</sup> day of November 1785. This tract interferes twenty nine acres and one hundred and ten perches with the John Kerr survey Henry Sipe conveyed to Michael Sipe whose heirs conveyed to Frederick Deshong who also claimed under John Kerr and is the present owner.
