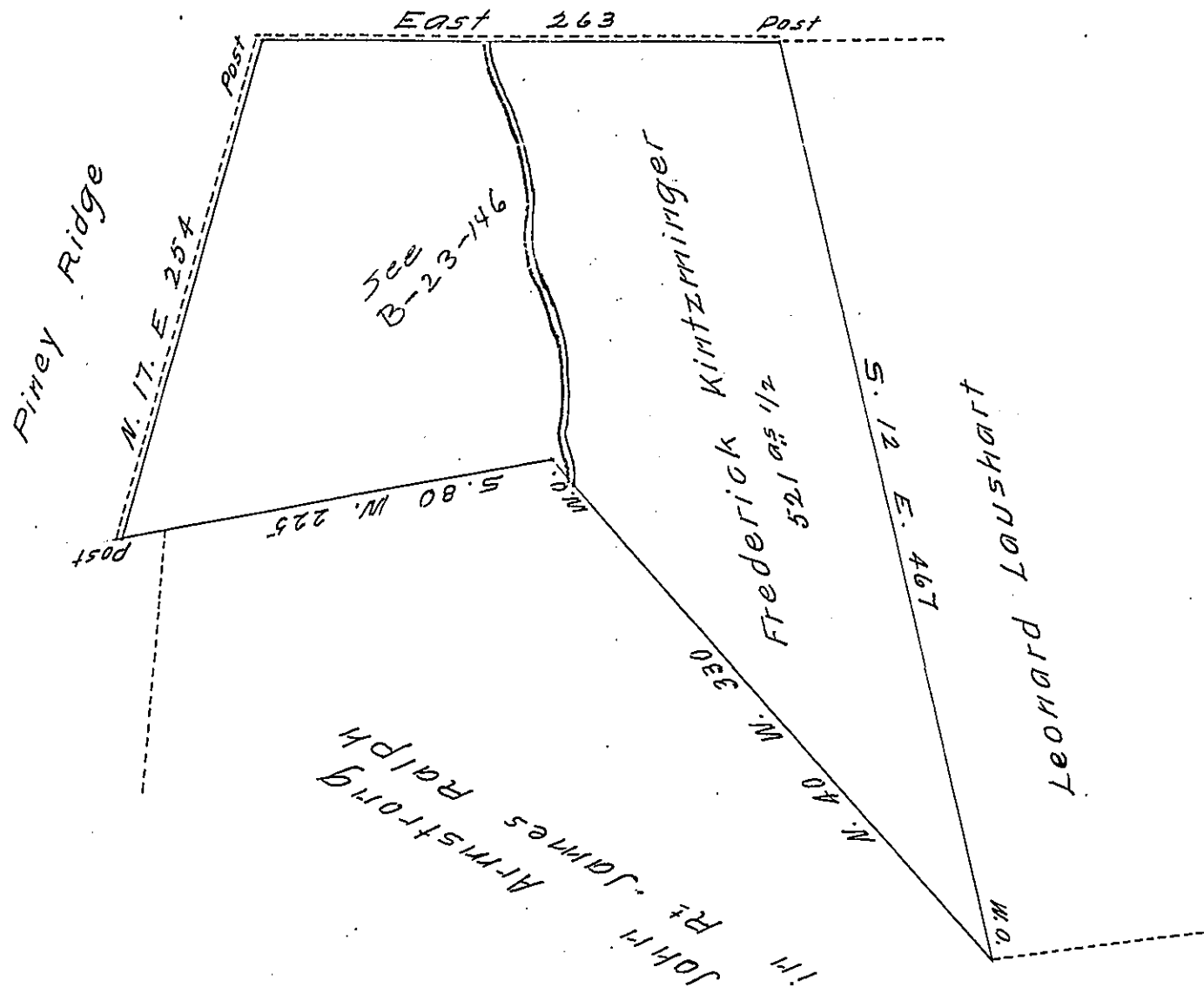


Vacant Hills



Situate on the waters of three Spring Creek and near Jack's Mountain, in Springfield township Huntingdon County containing five Hundred and one & one half acres and allowance of six per cent for roads, surveyed 2<sup>nd</sup> of May 1766 on warrant granted to Frederick Kintzmingler dated the 1<sup>st</sup> day of August 1766

The dotted lines represent part of the draught of a survey made for James Ralph on warrant dated the 31<sup>st</sup> day of May 1762. This survey interferes five hundred and twenty one acres and one half acre with the Frederick Kintzmingler tract. James Ralph conveyed to John Baynton Samuel Wharton & George Morgan, who also claimed under Frederick Kintzmingler, they conveyed to Richard Neave, sen<sup>r</sup> and Richard Neave, Jr who conveyed to Richard Ashman, who devised to John & George Ashman the present owners.

IN TESTIMONY that the above is a copy of the original remaining on file in the Department of Internal Affairs of Pennsylvania, made conformably to an Act of Assembly approved the 16th day of February, 1833, I have hereunto set my Hand and caused the Seal of said Department to be affixed at Harrisburg, this first day of December 1908
