


FORM NO. 1.



Draught of a tract of land situate in Fannet township Franklin County containing 237 acres 104 perches & allowance of six per cent for roads &c resurveyed 27 October 1829. In pursuance of a contract with the Board of Property for carrying into effect the several acts of Assembly relating to unpatented lands under proprietary rights &c, and by virtue of a warrant dated 8th June 1762 granted to James Long for 200 acres in Path Valley "joining James Galbreath's tract of 200 acres"

Report-The above tract was surveyed 26 May 1763 in dispute between James Galbreath and James Long, on warrants to both parties as appears by an old draft found in office-No other land found applicable to Lang's warrant. Note-Appears also to have been returned on a warrant to James Galbreath dated 20 Feb^y 1755 as per list no 1 of unpatented lands, and held under said title
