



In pursuance of the several acts of Assembly directing the recovery of the principal and interest due to the Commonwealth from persons holding lands by virtue of Locations on other office titles issued from or under the proprietary Government and by the authority of the Board of property I have this 20th day of February 1828 Surveyed the above described tract of Three hundred and Seven acres & a half and allowance of six percent on the right hand of the Kittanning path with a small Spring on it running into Conemaugh adjoining lands of Thomas Wilkins Fred^l Boyer Moses Stewart and others Situate in Blacklick Township Indiana County By virtue of a Location granted to ^{Samuel} ~~Robert~~ Culbertson on the 3^d April 1769 N^o 1873.

N.B. so much of the above Survey as is represented by the dotted lines and the letters A B was surveyed to Thomas Wilkins the 5th June 1769 By order of the 3^d April 1769 and that including the letters C.D. was surveyed to Thomas Wilkins the 15th June 1789 By warrant of the 29th August 1785 and that part embracing the letter E was surveyed to Isaac Jennings on the 14th October 1813. By warrant of the 6th October 1813. N^o 2024 Pat^d, wth T. Wilkins Pat^d, I. Jennings - not returned.
