



Situate in White Deer township Union County about a mile Below the Old Indian fort surveyed the 26<sup>th</sup> June 1838 by virtue of an order Granted to Samuel Murray dated the 3<sup>d</sup> of April 1769 No 2008 Containing two Hundred & ninety eight Acres & fifty six perches & the Usual Allowance & c & is represented by the Black lines.

Note The same tract of land interferes & is included in two surveys one in the name of Deterich Rees & the other in the name of John Zimmerman Both Orders Dated 3<sup>d</sup> April 1769 & surveyed 22<sup>d</sup> & 23<sup>d</sup> days of October 1769 & is represented by the Dotted lines and is now owned by Jacob McCurly & others in right of the said Rees & Zimmerman
