



The part marked A is an interference of a Tract of Land containing 103 acres and allowance called "Hare's Trouble" surveyed on Hare's Warrant of 3^d December 1773, the 11th May 1774 - now in the possession of Henry Herring in Mount Pleasant Township Adams County - Patent T. & R. Penn to Thomas Armor 29th March 1760 for 138^{ac}

July 31st 1837

In^o L. Gubernator -

Note - Among the draughts in the possession of Jacob Metzger Esq^{re} of Harrisburg in York County I have found one with the following observations by Arch^d McClaine D.S. I think - "The Strip of land marked B appears by the draft of Anth'y Eyler's Land (marked C and patented by Jacob Metzger) to be Daniel Slagle's Land which is now the property of Christopher Hare - This fact being established by the returns of survey in the Su^r Gen^ls Office - It appears ~~to~~ that the warrant to Lawrence Shine must be either on the Land surveyed to Christopher Hare on his warrant of 3^d Dec^r 1773, or on Peter Frets in right of Andrew Harrier (since patented by Jacob Metzger) and therefore cannot ~~be~~ touch the Land of Patrick Mc Sherry &c."

IN TESTIMONY that the above is a copy of the original remaining on file in the Department of Internal Affairs of Pennsylvania, made conformably to an Act of Assembly approved the 16th day of February, 1833, I have hereunto set my Hand and caused the Seal of said Department to be affixed at Harrisburg, this twenty ninth day of October 1908
