



The part marked A. is an interference of a Tract of 16<sup>ac</sup> 38<sup>ps</sup> & all<sup>ce</sup> surveyed to John Neely now owned by Will<sup>m</sup> Mumert in Reading Town<sup>e</sup> Adams County now unpatented - It appears that a survey was made on Warrt dated 20<sup>th</sup> feb 1746 - to Thomas Neely, to include the warrant to John Neely dated 16<sup>th</sup> May 1745, and in the calculations of that survey there appears an error happened, as it is stated to contain 160<sup>ac</sup> 2 roods - 16 Perches in the Part B. - and probably to cover the part A application was made for the warrant 18<sup>th</sup> oct. 1753 for 20 acres - Parts A & B. actually contain but 146<sup>ac</sup> 38<sup>ps</sup> & all<sup>ce</sup> According to S. Sloan's survey since made. Witness my hand
