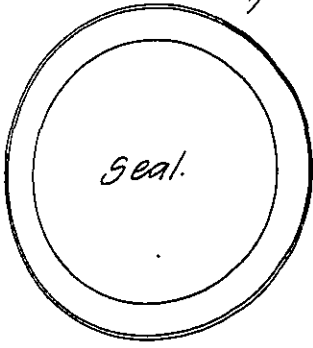


Pennsylvania *ps.*

By the Commissioners of Property

At the Request of Joseph Cox of the County of Chester that we would grant him to take up about Two hundred Acres of Land on the West side of Brandywine Creek in the said County for which he agrees to pay to the Proprietors use five and twenty pounds for one Hundred Acres and soe proportionable for the rest and the usual yearly Quitrent of one Shilling Sterling for the said Hundred Acres and in like proportion for the rest as aforesaid. These are to authorize and Require thee to Survey or cause to be Survey'd unto the said Joseph Cox in the place aforesaid the said Tract or parcell of Land Provided the same be clear of all other surveys and Claims and make a Returne thereof into the Secretarys Office Which Survey in case the said Joseph fulfill the above agreement within three months after Location shall be valid otherwise the same is to be void as if it had never been made or this Warrant ever granted Given under our Hands and Seale of the Province <sup>at Philad<sup>a</sup></sup> the 25<sup>th</sup> day of the 7<sup>th</sup> Month Anno Dom 1714
