


I do hereby Certifie that by Vertue of a Warrant under the hand and Seal of Edward Penington Surveyor Gen<sup>l</sup> to Isaac Taylor directed bearing date the 23<sup>d</sup> day of December 1701 (And pursuant to the Proprietaries Commissioner's warrant to the said Edw<sup>d</sup> Penington bearing date the 22<sup>d</sup> day of <sup>br</sup>10 1701) authorizing him to Survey unto John Chalfan 250 acres of land in the Mannor of Rocklands. The said Isaac Taylor hath made return into the General Surveyors office of the Survey of 200 acres Survey'd to the said John Chalfan the other fifty acres being granted and Survey'd to J<sup>r</sup> Rockingham by vertue-a warrant from the Commissioners of Property dated the 18<sup>th</sup> of the 12<sup>th</sup> Mo. 1701. The said-Chuffans land beginning at a post at the corner of Edward Wilbourn's Land from thence extending west in the line of Birmingham township thirteen perches to a Chestnut tree thence South west by west by the line of the said Birmingham Township one hundred and eighteen perches to a post thence south south east in the line of John Reckingham's Land two hund<sup>d</sup> thirty six perches to a post thence east north east one hundred twenty eight perches and a half in Francis Chadsey's line to a post thence North North west by Edward Wilbourn's Land two hundred fifty seven perches to the first mentioned corner post Containing two hundred acres of Land as aforesaid. Jacob Taylor.
