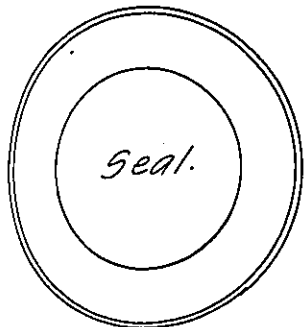


Pennsylvania*By the Commissioners of Property*

At the request of Jonathan Cockshaw that we would grant him to take up for the use of the Children of his late brother Thomas Musgrove five hundred acres of land in this Province in part of seven hundred and fifty acres purchased of the Proprietary by the said Thomas in England. These are to require the forthwith to Survey and lay out to the Heirs of the said Thomas Musgrove the said quantity of five hundred acres of land in this Province where not already Survey'd nor taken up, nor is concealed nor Sealed by the Indians and make Returns thereof into the General Surveyors Office at Philadelphia where this Warr^t is to remain and a Copy thereof to be delivered to thee Certified by the Secretary under our hands and the Seal of the Province at Philadelphia the 5th 1702.
