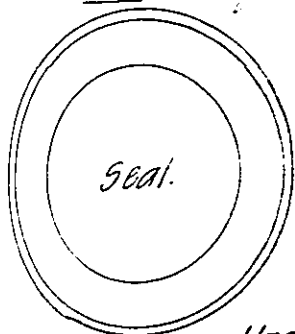


Pennsylvania 13.



By the Commissioners of Property.

Upon an agreement now made with John Cadwalader of the County of Chester for two Hundred Acres of Land Scituate near the land late laid out to Jeremiah Jermain ^{in y^e said County} for which the said John is to pay to the Proprietors Use five and Twenty Pounds ≡ and the usual Yearly Quitrent of two Shilling Sterling for y^e Same These are to Authorize and Require thee to Survey or cause to be Survey'd unto the said John Cadwalader in y^e place aforesaid according to y^e Method of Townships appointed the said quantity of Two hundred acres of Land that has not been already Survey'd nor appropriated nor is Seated by the Indians and make a Return thereof into the Secretarys office which Survey in case the said John Pay down at y^e Survey Twelve pounds ten Shillings and the like Sum within three Months after the date hereof shall be Valid Otherwise the same is to be Void as if it had never been made nor this warrant ever granted. Given under our hands and Seal of the Province at Philadelphia the 22^d day of y^e 9th Month Anno Qui. 1715.
