At the Request of Jn^o Budd That I would grant him to take up five hundred Acres of Land in right of W^m Bowman old Purchaser who sold of h^(obl.) Right to Sam^l Richardson who sold to W^m Frampton 1500 Acres w^{ch} were granted by Warr^t dated ye 5th of ye 5^m 1686. but only 500 Acres there of were laid out. and the right of the remaining thousand sold to ye s^d J. Budd. These are to require thee forthwith to Survey or cause to be Survey'd unto him the s^d John Budd the Said Number of five hundred acres of Land in the County of Chester that has not been already Survey'd. laid out nor taken up nor is concealed nor Seated by the Indians. according to ye Method of Townships by me appointed And make Returns there of into my Secretaries Office. Given under my hand and Seal at Philad^{ia} the 11th day of ye 12th Moth 170⁹11
