

Draft of a Tract of land situate in  
St. Thomas township (formerly Hopewell  
township) Franklin County. Containing One Hundred & Ninety Seven acres.  
One Hundred & fifty perches and allowance of Six percent for roads & Located  
the 15<sup>th</sup> of April 1830. (on a Warrant granted William Rankin for 200<sup>as</sup> of land in Hopewell township on each side of a Branch of Conococheague - Join<sup>g</sup> Thos Armstrong &  
dated 4<sup>th</sup> of August 1738  
Sutherland's Cabin). In pursuance of a Contract with the Board of property for carrying  
into effect the several acts of Assembly Relating to proprietary Rights &c.

The land above described is wholly the same as a Survey said to contain 198<sup>as</sup>  
22 per. & all which was surveyed in pursuance of an Application granted James  
McFarland dated the 30<sup>th</sup> of March 1767. No 3273 under which the present owner  
claims the place marked & thus is where the improvement of W<sup>m</sup> Rankin is said to  
have been made at a very early period. There is no evidence of any Survey having  
been made on the above Warrant but the land is recognised as W<sup>m</sup> Rankin's  
by an adjoining Survey in 1738 and an old Residenter says James McFar-  
land purchased from W<sup>m</sup> Rankin.
