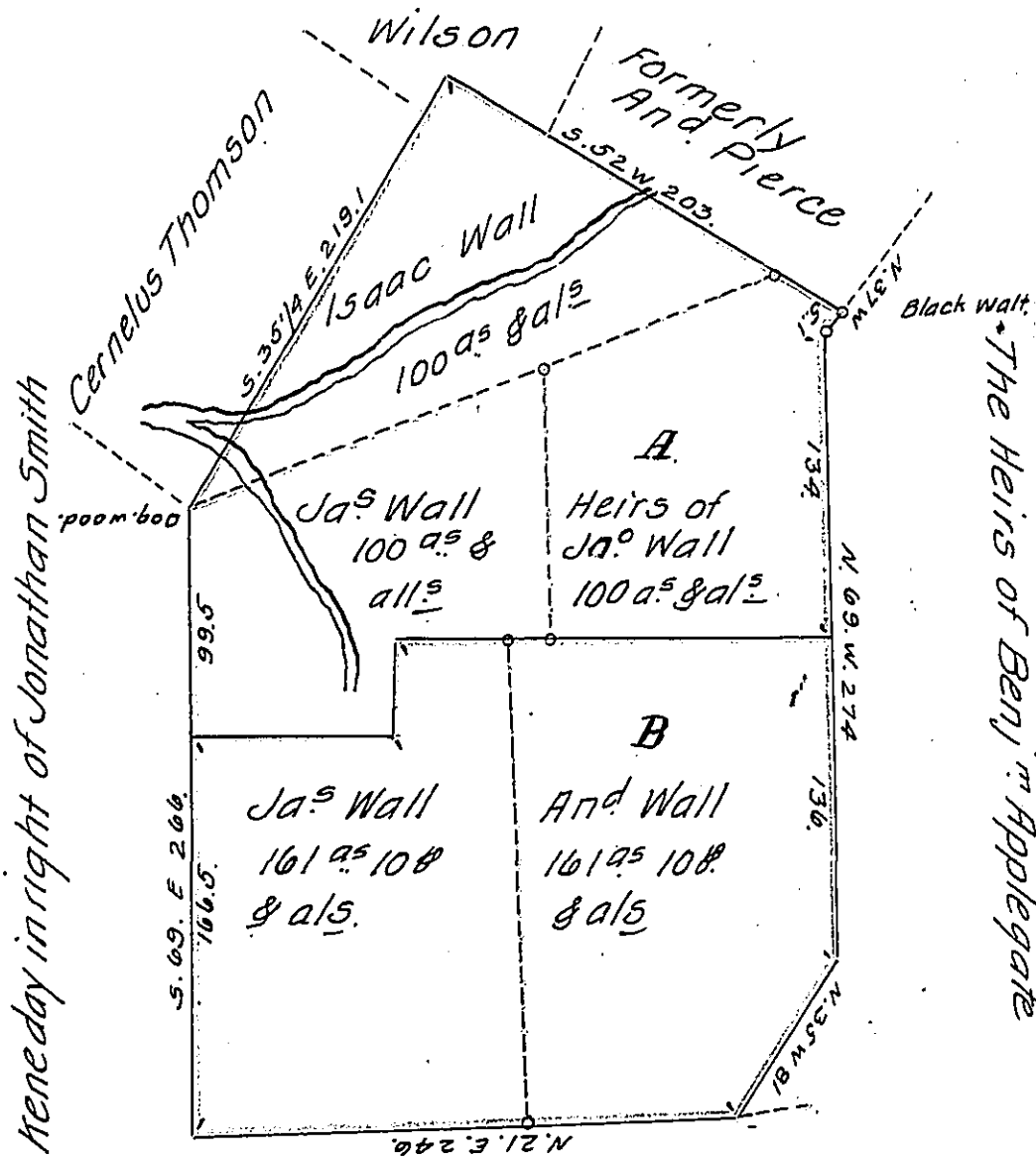

Pursuant to the instructions of the Board of Property of the State of Pennsylvania, dated the 1st day of Nov^r 1827 & the authority therein, I have attended to the duties mentioned, and respectfully report the following Notes &c. as the results of the investigations had upon the premises &c.

Note A & B. Represents James and Walter Walls plantations. I am informed by one of the oldest sons that they sent to the land office with a view of getting an order for each of them, but through some mistake the order came jointly - never the less on that order the two tracts was surveyed under one containing 644 Ac^s 66 P^s in November 1787 - It was resurveyed into two tracts on Warrants dated July 10th 1786, containing ^{Each} 322^{as} - 10^{ps} & 322^{as} - 46^{ps} and since that it has been divided into five parts as in the above draft.

The above survey is in Elizabeth Township Allegheny County.
