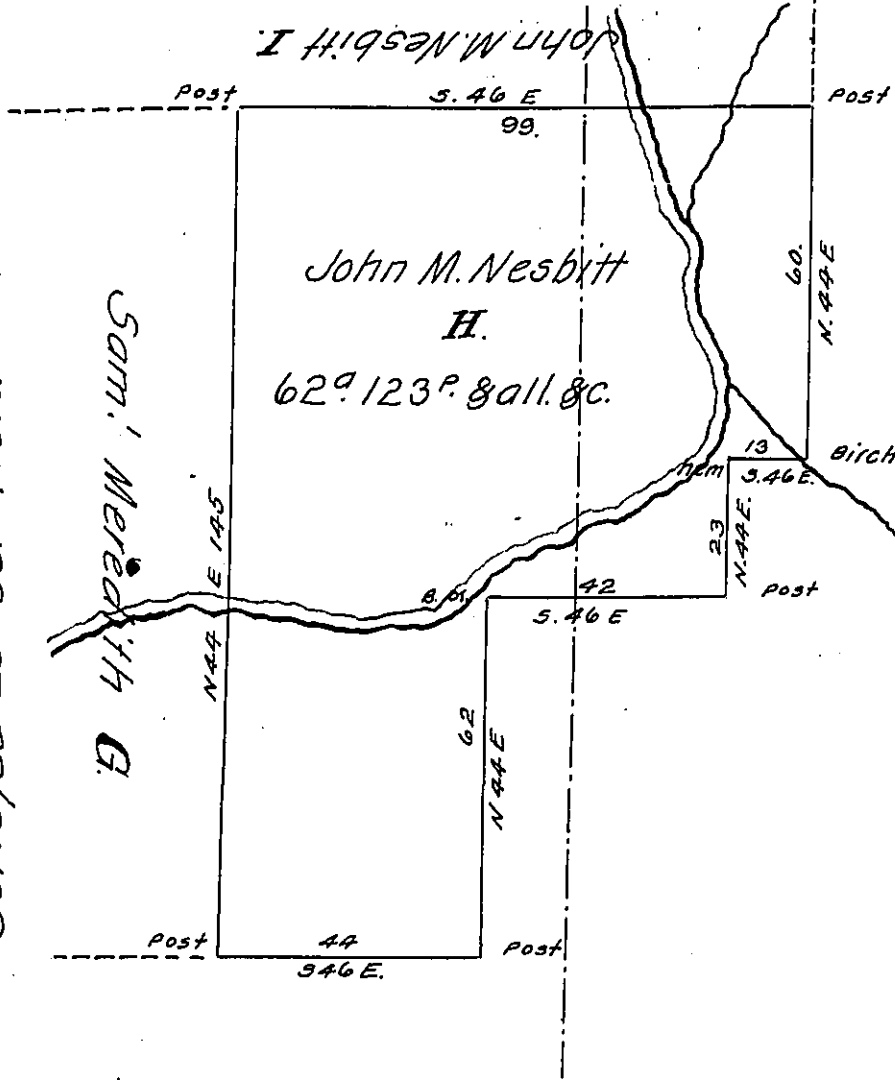

Draught of a tract of land Situate on the South branch of Tunkhannock Creek partly in Abington and partly in Nicholson townships (the creek being the division line.) in the County of Luzerne. and adjoining land Surveyed for Samuel Meredith warrant marked G. Containing sixty two acres and one hundred & twenty three perches of land besides the usual allowance & c. The above described tract of land was surveyed as appears by blocking the trees upon the ground in 1792. and was resurveyed for John M. Nesbitt the 10<sup>th</sup> day of July 1828. By virtue of his warrant dated the 28<sup>th</sup> day of December 1774. marked H. In pursuance of the authority derived from the Board of Property, under the act of Assembly of the 22<sup>nd</sup> of March 1820 entitled "An act directing the recovery of principle and interest due to the Commonwealth from persons holding lands by virtue of locations and other Office titles, issued from under the Proprietary Government and for other purposes, and the Supplement thereto, passed the 11<sup>th</sup> day of April 1825.
