In the Forks of White Deer hole Creek about 3½ miles from the mouth joining W<sup>m</sup> Cox & on the upper side thereof incl<sup>g</sup> two springs. extends up the Creek about 250 Rods. thence back towards the 5<sup>th</sup> branch of said Creek, chiefly Walnut, Ash & Shellbark Hickory in the bottom & White Oak & Black Oak upland including his impt.

David Duncan appears to include the ground above described on App<sup>n</sup> N<sup>o</sup> 72, dated 3<sup>d</sup> April 1769. Situate in Washington Township, Lycoming County. Sam<sup>t</sup> Hepburn Esq<sup>r</sup> & the heirs of Comly own the above.
