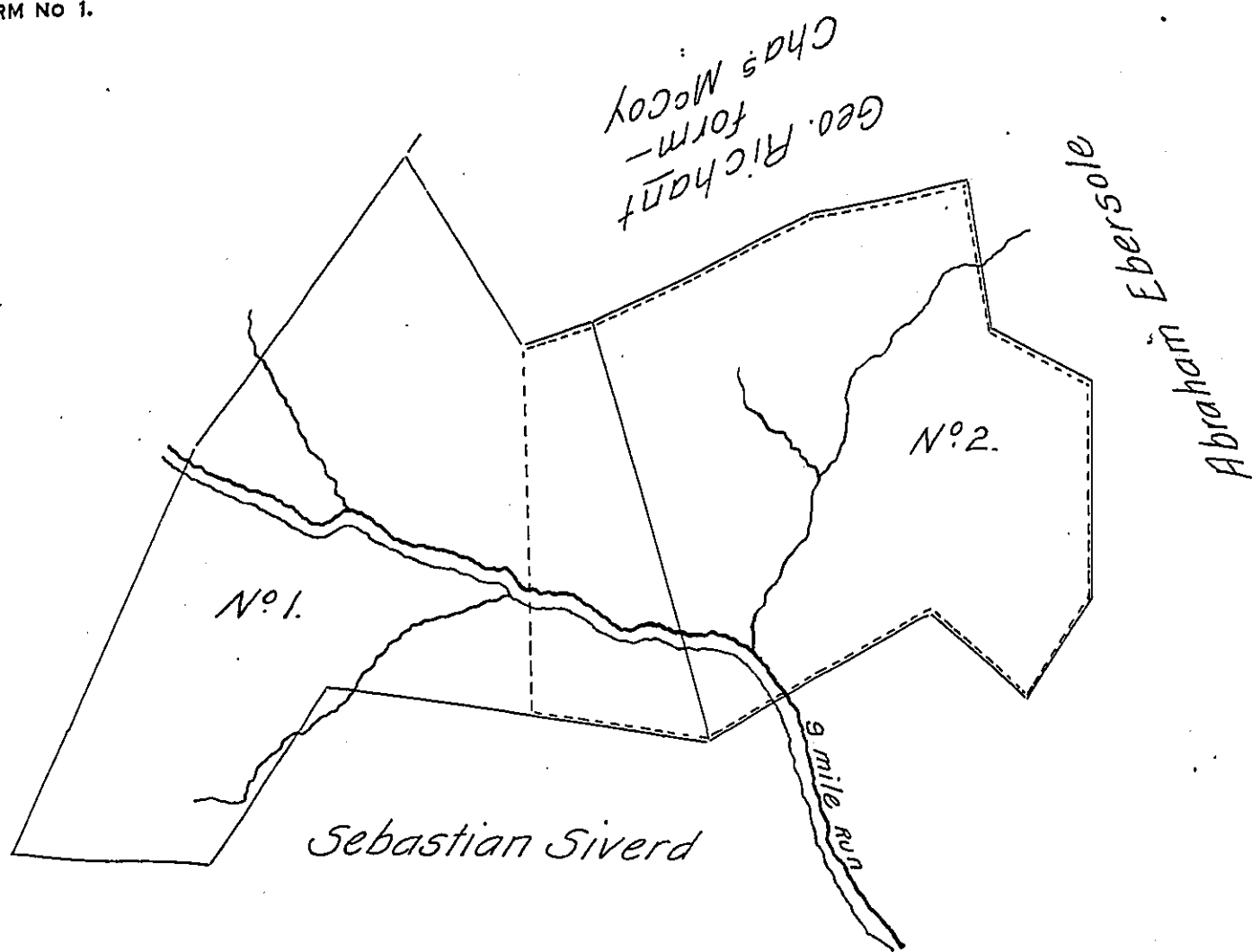


FORM NO 1.



The tract N°1 was Surveyed and Returned on a warrant granted to Frederick Pershin bearing date of February 22^d 1785.

N°2. was Surveyed on Application N°3030 dated 11th of April 1769 and a warrant of Acceptance issued to Jeremiah Fiscus and Henry Furry to whom also a patent was granted.

William Ferguson had settled on the above land early sometime previous to the revolution and was shortly afterwards dispossessed of it by force. Charles Fiscus had a claim to it and by the aid of some others threw him out. after sometime he again settled on it. but for some crime or other had to fly the County and was killed at Laughreys Defeat in Kentucky.
