 in Penns township Union County. Surveyed the 14<sup>th</sup> day of  
 May 1835 by Virtue of an Order dated the 3<sup>d</sup> day of April 1769  
 N<sup>o</sup> 2700 Granted to Martin Sumers, Containing three Hundred  
 and ten Acres & ten perches & the Usual Allowance &c.  
 Note. The Same tract of land was Surveyed the 26<sup>th</sup> day of  
 Dec<sup>r</sup>. 1785 for Theobald Miller in pursuance of his Order  
 dated the 7<sup>th</sup> day of October 1767. and now Owned by Dan!  
 Grotzer & others in right of the said Theobald Miller.
