Situate on the south east side of the Raystown Branch of Juniatta — & Below the mouth of Trough Creek. In Hopenwell township Huntingdon County containing one hundred and eighteen acres and twenty nine perches and allowance. Surveyed for John Simpson on order No. 1467 dated the 10th day of October 1766.

To Jacob Spangler Esqr. S.G. Daniel Africa. D.S.

The dotted lines and river represent the draught of a tract of land surveyed for Jacob Hess on warrant dated the 14th day of June 1828 This tract interferes one hundred and eighteen acres and twenty nine perches with the John Simpson survey. Levi More first improved this tract about the year 1770, he conveyed to Thomas Gitterale who sold to one Cathi who conveyed to Levi More who conveyed to Abraham Heaston, who conveyed to Henry Zimmerman who conveyed to Jacob Hess who obtained the aforesaid warrant and conveyed to Jacob Groves the present owner. It appears that Richard Tea Esqr. claimed the location in the name of John Simpson and that he abandoned said claim. Jacob Hess patented.

IN TESTIMONY that the above is a copy of the original remaining on file in the Department of Internal Affairs of Pennsylvania, made conformably to an Act of Assembly approved the 16th day of February, 1833, I have hereunto set my Hand and caused the Seal of said Department to be affixed at Harrisburg, this twenty-ninth day of September 1908.
