No. 1 represents a survey made for Robert Boggs on order No. 1300 dated the 20th day of September 1766. this survey interferes two hundred and five acres and eight perches with the Jacob Miller survey Robert Boggs conveyed to William Brown who conveyed to Joseph Obourn who devised the same to Joseph Obourn the present owner.

No. 2 represents part of a survey made for Joseph Obourn on warrant dated the 28th day of August 1794 This survey interferes twenty five acres and fifty perches with the Jacob Miller tract, Joseph Obourn, who devised the same to Joseph Obourn the present owner.
