



In pursuance of the several acts of Assembly directing the recovery of the principal and interest due to Commonwealth from persons holding lands by virtue of Locations or other office rights issued from or under the Proprietary government and by Authority from the Board of Property I have this 9th day of April 1838 Surveyed the above described tract of Three hundred and six acres & a half and allowance of six per cent joining land granted to Frederick Stone on the heads of Plum Creek & adjoining lands of John Leasure Harrison Leroy and Jan Linklearn & others Situate in Mahoning township Indiana County By virtue of a warrant granted to Peter Backman the 25th of January 1774.
