



In pursuance of the Several Acts of Assembly directing the recovery of the principal and interest due to the Commonwealth from persons holding lands by virtue of location or other office titles issued from or under the proprietary government and by authority from the board of Property I have this 11th day of March 1838 surveyed the above described tract of three hundred acres & allowance of six per cent joining land granted to James Glentworth on the waters of Blackleg creek situate in Conemaugh township in the county of Indiana By virtue of a warrant granted to Henry Hill the 26th of March 1776.
