



In pursuance of the Several Acts of Assembly directing the recovery of the principal and interest due to the Commonwealth from persons holding lands by virtue of Locations or other office titles issued from or under the Proprietary Government and by authority from the Board of Property. I have on this 12th day of March 1828 Surveyed the above described tract of Two hundred and eighty acres and allowance of six per cent adjoining lands of Isaac Allen and including the run upwards Situate in Conemaugh township in the county of Indiana By virtue of a ~~warrant~~ <sup>warrant</sup> granted to Abraham Hunt the 31<sup>st</sup> of December 1773.

The persons who are in possession of this tract say that the owner ( who does not reside in that part of the country) has the title to the above land and think it is patented in the name of Abraham Hunt, but I could make out nothing certain respecting it there is no papers belonging to it in the Deputy Surveyors office. The owners name is William Coleman.
