a survey made to William Rankin on the 7th of May

1828 a return whereof is herewith enclosed. The above survey of John Reed was claimed by William Rankin as his heirs and sold to John Reed a number of years ago. When the time came that Rankin was to make a title no warrant or survey could be found by which a title could be made. Rankin then agreed with Reed to take a warrant on his improv^t and complete the title himself, which has been done and a patent issued. There is no doubt but this claim of Rankin's was founded upon this 50 acre warrant, but there being much more land claimed than could be returned upon the warrant no return had consequently been made. It is situate about the proper distance from James Harriltons improvement but is on the west side instead of the East side of the creek. It is owned and occupied by John Reed who claims under the title in his own name. There is now no person claiming under this title to William Rankin.
