 The dotted line and the letters A & B represent the survey made to David Smith on the 20 March 1828. By warrant of the 8 June 1773 a return whereof is herewith enclosed. It appears that Joseph Mc Donald never obtained an office title for his land, the above survey represents what is now claimed by himself and family - these are several improvements upon this tract. Samuel Mc Donald lies upon that part now surveyed upon Smith's warrant.

Old Mr. Mc Donald informs me that he was acquainted with the claims of Daniel Smith that he claimed the land & objected to the executing of the warrant when it was many years ago attempted to be laid, he still claims the land.
