



In pursuance of the several acts of assembly directing the recovery of the principal and interest due to the Commonwealth from persons holding lands by virtue of Locations or other office titles issued from or under the proprietary Government and of the authority of the Board of property I have this 11<sup>th</sup> day of December A. D. 1827 surveyed the above described tract of land containing Three hundred and one acres and allowance of six per cent adjoining lands of John Brand Jeremiah Williamson John Nagle Benjamin Davis and others on the north side of the Two lick creek and on the heads of Ramseys run emptying into said creek below the Two-licks Situate in Green township in the county of Indiana. By virtue of a warrant granted to Robert Wallace on the 2<sup>d</sup> day of December 1773.
