



Surveyed This Tract of Land to George Backman in Right of Mordecai Maddock By Vertue of an order from Jacob Taylor bearing date Jenauary the 2. 172⁷/₈. Graended on a Warrant bearing date the 1st day of Deesember 1726. Begining at a whit-oak standing neare a branch of Sockunk - in a timber Swamp then West One hundred Sixty fower pear^{ch} to a black oak. then South three hundred and twelfe pearches by land surveyed to William Allon to a smal hickry. then East One hundred and Sixty fower pearches by land Surveyed to W. Ahton to a chesnot oak, then North three hundred and twelfe pearches by John Youders Juners Land to the Place of begining. Containig thre-hundred acres with usual allowance for Roads Surveyed in May 1730 by
