At the Request of William Branson, Son of Nathaniel Branson of the County of Berks in England Purchaser of Twelve hundred and fifty Acres of Land from the Prop^r in the Year 1683. That we would grant him to take up Six hundred and Seventy five Acres more of the sd Land above what is already granted, the whole Said Purchase being convey'd unto him the said William by his said Father. These are to Authorize and Require thee to Survey or cause to be Survey'd to the Said William Branson according to the Method of Townships appointed, the Said quantity of Six hundred & Seventy five Acres of Land in this Province that is vacant and not enclosed nor Seated by the Indians, and make Returns there of into the Secretaries Office. Given under our hands and Seal of the Said Province at Philad^a the Sixteenth day of Octob^r 1708.
