


By a Warrant from the Commissioners of Property Dated the 6th day of the First month 171⁶. There was Survey^d and laid out the 28th day of the same Month and Year unto John Bull three hundred acres of Land in the County of Philadelphia in that part of Gilberts Mannor Joyning to the London Company's Land. Beginning at post at a Corner of the London Company's Land in a Line of William Lane's land Thence North West by the said Lane's Land three hundred and two perches to a Corner post. Then by the Mannor land South West two hundred perches to a Corner post. Thence South East by the Mannor land two hundred and two pches to a Corner post. Then North East forty Eight perches to an Ash tree forking into three parts. Thence by the said Company's Land East by North one hundred Eighty six pches to the Place of Beginning.
